The Board was elected on the second scheduled International Café the 6<sup>th</sup> of September. The election was organized by the International Student Assistant Hallvard Layoll Nylena, and was based on a required board of four.

- Introduction

This introduction holds the Intentions and Purposes pertaining the activities of the International Students Union at HiO this Autumn Semester.

This particular Board has taken the following responsibilities upon itself with the global purpose of providing as much service to the tacit community of international students at the Høgskolen I Oslo as possible. We base our behaviour and our work of this particular Board as our directive and we work:

- To follow and respect the laws that pertain the overpowering institutions and forces of the ISU.
- To Guard the interests of this already mentioned tacit community of international students of the HiO.
- To provide, organize, finance and generate integration activities to ensure an internationalization of culture and an internationalized environment to further enhance the experience of an international student in Norway.
- To provide aid/support on academic issues (whichever these may be, or however they may present themselves) to the furthest extent allowed by the appropriate academic authorities of the HiO.
- To establish a change-sensitive budget plan, with focus on activity-bound spending. Being these funds provided through and by the International Office at the HiO.

- International Café

The International Café is the centre of all ISU activity. Besides e-mails and normal encounters with the students during classes it is the Café the Axis for all communications with the international community. The whole purpose of the café itself is a representation of the Presence of the ISU on a weekly basis to remember the students of this organism which was created and which works for their behalf only.

Every week a different sort of activity is planned within this international café, where the normal basis is free coffee and tea, with a great variety of free cookies, candy and other assorted “goodies”. The Activities have varied so far as a scope of a pizza dinner night, and an International Pub Quiz. A whole list of activities stands on the waiting list, yet deeper insight has to be acknowledged into it.
